The Ugardan borders are open! But...

I am regularly asked why I am still in the Netherlands, which is understandable. The Ugandan borders have been open since October 1 (yay!) so I could indeed leave now to Uganda. Nevertheless, my departure date is scheduled in -God willing- April 2021. Why?

- 1. What many people don't know is that a lot has to be arranged before you can be sent out for a longer period of time. Insurance, writing a plan, making the website up-to-date, good and clear communication, making a budget, building financial supporters, talks with the church, psychological and medical test, writing newsletters, etc. (yes, the latter takes more time than you might think (: Just try 'writing your heart, and the process of letting go & preparing', on paper in a few words with the wish that everyone understands exactly what you are talking about believe me, that will cost a couple of hours;)).
- 2. There will be elections in Uganda in february 2021. This could maybe cause national chaos. People advize me to wait first and see how the elections will develop.
- 3. We hope that my boyfriend Derrick can come to the Netherlands this November/December. We find it very important that he sees the Netherlands, my culture, and my friends & family, before I leave for Uganda. Also we think it's important that he meets the people of ITeams NL (my mission agency) and the people of my church. We are now waiting and pray that he gets his visa.



'A Joyful Special Needs Ministry rooted in Love Itself'

This is my heart, my Vision and my Mission summarized in one sentence! And actually I'm saying it wrong now, because ... it's Gods heart! Zephaniah 3:17+19. In the Bible we get to know God, and we read there that His heart overflows with Joy and Love for people with disabilities and for people who are rejected. He cares for them and looks out for them! In recent weeks, God has been deeply worked in my heart and He made me discover this more and more, for example through the course of Joni & friends (Beyond Suffering) that I'm doing right now. Very precious!

Together with International Teams, I thought about 4 sentences that will form the guidelines for my work with Special Needs people in Uganda:

- 1. The Special Joy God has for special people. (God)
- 2. The Special Joy and acceptance that special people may find in themselves, through the relationship with God and Jesus' finished work. (Myself)
- 3. The Special Joy that special people may share within their family and community. (People around them)
- 4. The Special Joy that special people add to the worldwide Church as being part of the Body of Christ. (World)
