Recently, we have been able to really invest in building relationships with people with disabilities and their families. That's exactly a big reason, the drive, the vision and mission of my stay here, so I can't tell you with enough joy that it's wonderful to see that taking shape!

The families we support do not receive any help. The need and help of us also differ per family. For some this is financial help, for others medical help, and for others practical help. We do what we can and what is in our power. We also work closely with existing organizations and contacts. In recent years I have invested a lot in network building during my short trips to Uganda and that is now coming in handy! Nice to be able to work together like this!

The core value of Special Joy is relationship. To really see people, to leave people in their value or to encourage them in the fact that they are of value, to love people as Jesus loves them. We often see that these people are more of a burden than a Joy. And I have to admit, families with people with disabilities face many additional challenges, in the midst of pre-existing poverty, corruption, unemployment and/or poor health care. This can be really difficult, which is why we want to support them as best we can. We are grateful that the people with disabilities within Special Joy all have a family around them who takes care of them, as best they can. At the same time, we see a lot of room for improvement and to make things easier for them in various areas, and that's why we want to stand next to them out of God's love!
